It is a challenging job, it is rewarding public service which involves helping others, it is never monotonous or routine—and there's ACTION!

**EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES** During the last several years attritional losses and difficulties in recruiting enough qualified applicants have resulted in an average of 30 to 60 job vacancies in the Police Officer classification. Therefore, those who can meet our minimum requirements may be employed immediately.

**MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS** Be a citizen of the USA, be at least 20½ and not have reached 35th birthday, high school graduate or GED, 5'8" to 6'3" with weight in proportion, pass a rigid medical examination, have minimum 20/30 vision correctible to 20/20 with depth perception in normal limits, pass stringent character investigation including polygraph examination, must be able to swim a minimum of 100 yards as part of a complete athletic test, must have or be able to qualify for a Florida driver's license. Ordinarily the testing process may cover several weeks, but out of town applicants are given preferential consideration to complete all testing except background check in about four days. Tests are especially scheduled to save their time, spare unnecessary expense and avoid jeopardizing their regular employment if disqualified.

**MILITARY APPLICANTS** Applicants in the military service may obtain early release up to 90 days if accepted as a Police Officer under a new program announced last fall by the DoD. While we wish to cooperate in this program in every way possible, applicants must come here for testing in person. Those who take leave and come here to apply will be given the same preferential consideration extended to other out of town applicants as described in the preceding paragraph. Those meeting our minimum standards after successful completion of all tests will be certified for employment to appropriate military authorities so the early release may be obtained by the individual applicant.
